NEW Guidance for Pollution Prevention (GPPs) formerly known as Pollution Prevention Guidelines (PPGs)

The NEW series of **Guidance for Pollution Prevention (GPPs)** is available now. The GPPs provide environmental good practice guidance for the whole U.K, and environmental regulatory guidance directly to Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales.

To date we have released the following GPPs:

- GPP 2: Above ground oil storage tanks
 For above ground oil storage, excluding oil refineries and distribution depots. (January 2017)
- GPP 5: Works and maintenance in or near water
 For construction or maintenance works near, in, or over water. (January 2017)
- GPP 24: Stables, kennels, catteries
 For managing and operating stables, kennels and catteries. (January 2017)

We will be adding more GPPs to the series over the coming months, so keep an eye on the <u>GPP Pages</u> on the NetRegs website.

Fees and Charges Update



The Pollution Prevention and Control (Fees and Charges) Scheme (Northern Ireland) 2017

Operators of PPC (Pollution Prevention and Control) activities are required to pay a fee to the government regulator to cover the regulator's costs.

This is in line with the 'Polluter Pays' key principle, where the operator bears the cost of any measures to prevent environmental harm that they may cause.

The Pollution Prevention and Control (Fees and Charges) Scheme (Northern Ireland) 2017 sets the fees and charges for 2017/2018 relating to Part A and Part B permits.

This scheme identifies the fees and charges associated with the initial registration of a radioactive source, its variation and for its annual subsistence.

EU Emissions Trading Fees and Charges 2017

NIEA regulate installations subject to the EU Emissions Trading Scheme through the issue of permits to operate specific activities. Operators have to pay a fee associated with new applications, variations, tranfers and surrender of permits as well as an annual subsistence fee.

The 2017 charging scheme sets out the fees associated with each of the applications.



Animal by-products approved premises

DAERA has published on its website lists of premises and their operators in Northern Ireland who have been granted approval for the storage, processing, treatment or disposal of animal by-products, as required in accordance with the rules laid down by Regulation (EC) No. 1069/2009 as implemented by Regulation (EU) 142/2011 and The Animal By-Products (Enforcement) Regulations (NI) 2011.





DAERA seeks proposals for group environmental farming projects

The Department of Agriculture, Environment and Rural Affairs (DAERA) has issued a call for facilitators to run 'Group' projects for farmers who are participating in the Environmental Farming Scheme (EFS).

DAERA is seeking proposals from individuals or



organisations from the environmental, farming or other land management sectors, or service providers with environmental land management experience and suitable facilitation skills.
